- 293. The custodial staff is overworked. Too few people are required to do too much work in too little time. They need more help. Unless they cut corners, they can't get all the work done. I don't think that classroom tables are ever wiped down with disinfectant. It is not their fault. The company requires too much of them, doesn't pay them enough, offers nothing in benefits, and doesn't give them enough hours. When the custodial staff was employed by CCPS the school was much cleaner, and we were all part of the school's team and the CCPS family.
- 294. The custodial staff needs to do a better job on dusting the classrooms and wiping/disinfecting desks on a regular basis. I have to do those things a few times a week.
- 295. The custodians need same benefits as CCPS employees.
- 296. The evening cleaning crew needs training on what to do...

- 297. The evening staff simply vacuum our carpets once or twice a week and empty the garbage each day. We have been out of paper towels and soap in our classroom and our class restrooms for 3 weeks. I have purchased my own paper towels and hand soap. Our desks and floors are only cleaned once a week.
- 298. The floor in my room is hardly ever mopped and the room looks dirty when I arrive in the morning.
- 299. The floors and surface areas are filthy. I consistently had to clean the floors myself with disinfecting wipes in order to remove build up and sticky, stained areas.
- 300. The floors in my room were disgusting for the entire year. They did partially sweep, but there was always a layer of grime on the surface. There was no cleaning of boards or dusting. I did all of the above.
- 301. The floors in the classrooms are always dirty.
- 302. the floors. they don't do a good job sweeping. I a pretty sure they don't sweep under my desk at all
- 303. The head of maintenance does not work well with teachers. He is confrontational, aggressive, and sways the principal in not believing the teachers who have legitimate requests.

- 305. The plant manager here is a do-nothing work dodger, except for giving special attention to Hispanics and admin.
- 306. The plant operator should walk around the campus and notice things that need to be cleaned or repaired.
- 307. The quality of cleanliness they provide is sometimes lacking. Dust was a problem in our classroom because it seems they mainly focus on wiping top surfaces and sweeping, then mopping the floors.
- 308. The staff isn't given enough time, support, and resources.
- 309. The way they treat their employees.
- 310. Their hours have been cut too short. They need additional time to clean at all properly
- 311. There is not enough staff to complete tasks to a high level of quality. The staff is also changing frequently because they are worked so hard and not compensated fairly.
- 312. There is obviously something wrong with the company when they have the high turnover that they do. Poor management? Too many tasks not enough man power? I don't know, but it is terrible.
- 313. There were cockroach issues in many classrooms at my school. Much of this is out of the hands of custodial staff as students kept food in lockers, but regular treatment for pests would be appreciated.
- 314. They are spread too thin and are unable to adequately do the job
- 315. They are under staffed and over worked. The school could be cleaned much better than it is being cleaned.

- 334. Turnover
- 335. Understaffed! Cleaning classrooms!!! They empty trash that's about all they have time for because there are not enough staff to do things properly. Again, another statement as to what our District thinks of their teachers!
- 336. Using teacher supplies and cleaning the bathroom properly. They do their best. But they have a lot to do in a short amount of time.
- 337. vacuum
- 338. vacuuming and dusting
- 339. vacuuming rugs cleaning offices
- 340. wait until the room is empty before cleaning
- 341. Washing the floors.
- 342. We need more custodial staff to keep the school clean. Also, we need more bathroom supplies (i.e., toilet paper, paper towels, soap) and better quality of these supplies.
- 343. We need more staff and better vacuums for the carpets.
- We ran out of hand soap and paper towels quite frequently throughout the school year. I put in at least a dozen workorders to get these things. Once we were out for 3 days straight and I had to buy my own soap.
- 345. We were severely understaffed this year and as a result, cleaning suffered. Soaps were never restocked, floors were not mopped, it was gross and unsanitary. A band aid was stuck to the sidewalk outside the office for several weeks.
- 346. When they clean the boy's bathroom, it smells like urine was spread everywhere. The paper towels are not checked often. There are roaches in lights etc... Their run through to clean is very quick.
- 347. White boards are not cleaned. Furniture is not regularly dusted. Student desks are not cleaned regularly.
- 348. Wiping the desks, cleaning and sanitizing the bathrooms EVERY DAY. Rooms need to be dusted.
- 349. Workorders for paper/soap/toilet paper should be unnecessary.
